The instructors determine the course content, materials, and cost of each class. All instructors are required to sign and be in agreement with our Sta tement of Faith and Mission Statement (available upon request). Parents are welcome and highly encouraged to attend classes with their children.

Legacy Homeschool Center does not employ instructors. They are under the employ of the families who have a student attending his/her class. For this reason, we do not pay the teachers; you, the parents, pay the teachers directly through a facilitator. The Board does, however, maintain supervisory authority. School District funds may not be used to pay for tuition, fees, and/or registration, or for the reimbursement thereof.

We cannot guarantee you will get the class(es) you request; however, each full class will maintain a waiting list.

All parents are required to:

- Pay tuition for classes on time.

High School Biology – Rhonda Zeutschel

Grade: 9 - 12

Class Size: 8 to 16

Cost: \$40 monthly, \$80 materials

Text: Biology with Laboratory Exercises for Christian Schools, BJUP, 3rd Ed (Vol. A&B)

Prerequisites: 9th graders MUST have complete d physical science

Description: This course provides a more advanced approach to Biology as the first se mester focuses on bioch emistry, microbiology, and biotechnology. The second half of the course does include the familiar topics of botany, zoology, and human anatomy. College format for lab r eports will be taught. Class time includes weekly quizzes, multimedia enhanced lectures, and a lab which reinforces the topic. While lectures are presented to introduce the material, students are expected to learn the text material at home to facilitate labs during class. Biochemistry and microbiology labs include: DNA extraction, gel electrophoresis (DNA fingerprinting), transformation of bacterial DNA, and use of microscopes for cytology and microbiology. Zoology labs include skeletal remains identification, eye, heart and brain dissections, as well as invertebrate, frog, and fetal pig dissections. Homework will take 4-8 hours per week - no late work accepted students must maintain a passing grade to remain in class.

Latin HS II/III – Deborah Langley

Grade: 9 - 12

Class Size: 7 to 15

Cost: \$18 monthly, \$20 materials

Text: varies by level - Wheelock's 6th ed. revised; Workbook for Wheelock's Latin 3rd ed. revised; English Grammar for Students of Latin; 501 Latin Verbs; Comprehensive Guide to Wheelock's Latin; plus readers: 38 Latin Stories; Duces Romanorum, Love Poetry

Prerequisites: Latin HS I

Description: HS II/III will be a one and one half hour class with 45 minutes teacher instruction time and 45 minutes of supervised translation lab work with TAs. Level II will be considerably more aggressive than HS I. Stud ents should be prepared to do 6-7 hours of homework a week. We will work through 23 chapters of Wheelock's Latin. HS III will take Latin enthusiasts through Wheelock's chapters 24-40. T his aggressive completion of Wheelock will be followed by in class and at home translations of classical Latin excerpts of prose and poetry. Students should be prepared to do 6-7 hours of homework a week. Students of both Latin HS II and III will be encouraged to take the National Latin Exam in March and preparation for the exam will be part of the course study including assigned reports. Students should purchase required texts and books and complete the first lesson prior to first class. Complete text lists and first assignment will be supplied by the teacher following registration.

Adventures In Art 2 – Rita Rothlisberger

Grade: 4 - 7 Class Size: 7 to 20 Cost: \$25 monthly, \$80 materials Text: Personal supplies of \$30 or less Prerequisites: Some previous art instruction is helpful but not required

Description: For the student who already knows the basics and desires a more in-depth study in the field of art. Students will learn to use a variet y of mediums such as temp era, watercolor, pastel, acrylics, collage, clay and colored pencil. Projects will focus on composition, depth, balance, focal point, and color. Students will study the works of fine artists of the past as well as the present. They will explore the different art styles and gain confidence as they discover their own personal style of art expression. All materials for the classroom will be provided in the materials fee. T here will be very little homework.

Grade: 1 - 3 Class Size: 12 to 25 Cost: \$20 monthly, \$32 materials Text: Provided by teacher

Prerequisites: None

Description: Romans 1:18 tells us God has r evealed His invisible attributes, His eternal power and His divine nature to mankind through His creation of the world. Using the creation week as our outline, we'll embark on an exciting adventure to learn more about God through science. With demonstrations, hands-on exploration and application of His word, we'll discover ways to use this informati on to glorify Him and concurrently lay the foundation for future science study . Although no homework is required, all students are encouraged to keep and review a science notebook. Activities for further enrichment outside of class time will be suggested.

<u>Character First! 1 And 2</u> – Carrie Myers and Allison Hurst Grade: 1 - 5

Class Size: 7 to 25

Cost: \$20 monthly, \$45 materials

Text: Provided by teacher, Character First! Education Curriculum

Prerequisites: None - Qualities are taught on a t wo year rotation thus different from last year.

Description: Children at the elementary level are at one of the most impressionable times in their lives, thus it is important to instill a good grasp of godly character at this age so it can guide them throughout life. There are eighteen character qualities which are taught using stories from Scripture, nat ure, and history, while fun songs, crafts, games, and more a dd to the enjoyment. Each child receives a 3-ring binder and beautifully illustrated trading cards for each quality, complete with character definitions and ways of implementing the qualities. Parents will receive an 8 $1/2 \times 11$ poster, a tabl e topper, and Parent Previews for each character quality to help reinforce the teachings at home. A wards are giv en for memorization of character definitions and applications

Digital Photography: Capture It! - Rhonda Sather

Grade: 8 - 12 Class Size: 8 to 25 Cost: \$25 monthly, \$30 materials

Text: None

Prerequisites: Each stude nt will need access to a digit al camera 4.0 megapixels or larger (point and shoot, or DSLR), and the camera's User Manual. The camera needs to be available to bring to each class.

Description: In this class we will learn camera operation, types of light, composition, exposure, rules of the trade and photograph presentation. We will also go over many techniques and composition elements that make a II the difference in a st riking photograph. Students will have time in class to explore the new concepts, ask questions and work with their cameras. We will have regular assignments to be completed as well. Student will also need to be a ble to print som e of their p ictures for assignments due (like at Costco photo). At the end of this class each student will have a portfolio showing their own style of 'capturing' their world.

Down To Earth (Formerly Navigating The Culture/Naturalism)

Steve Carrier
Grade: 9 - 12
Class Size: 10 to 25
Cost: \$20 monthly, \$10 materials

Text: Provided (students build their own workbook)

Prerequisites: Curiosity

Description: This is a rem odeled course that follows the basic theme of Navigating the Culture of Naturalism. The difference is an emphasis beyond the discussion of 'naturalism' vs. 'creation'; and centers on making sure the student is confident in his origin, identity, destiny, value and purpose. This class explores the current dominant culture of Naturalism (secular materialism) and associated evolutionary studies. Students learn the foundational arguments of the naturalistic culture, and more importantly, the student learns how to answer these arguments using disciplined science and logic. Creation Science is emphasized, and students are introduced to that place where physics meets metaphysics, where we discover the imprint of creation in the natural realm. Moreover, the students are encouraged to learn the meaning of this imprint a nd how we should be us ing it to enlarg e the Kingdom of God.

Experiencing Art With Judi, Grades 6-12 Beginning – Judi Byrne

Grade: 6 - 12 Class Size: 5 to 16 Cost: \$30 monthly, \$80 materials Text: None

Prerequisites: Portfolio for transportin g art. No exp erience required.

Description: The objective is to intro duce students into the world of art. T hey will experience the joy of trying different mediums, different papers, pencils, brushes, famous artists of the past, their styles and techniques, the world of color, and ways to explore the usage of line, texture and space. They will draw, paint, and cr eate a paper mache sc ulpture. I expla in and demonstrate each project, and give one on one support as time allows. I create a fun and frie ndly environment with soft classical music and a friendly personality. Projects can take from 1 week to several, depending on steps, and complexity. I try to have two art shows a year.

Geometry – Kristine Grigas Grade: 9 - 12

Class Size: 8 to 18

Cost: \$28 monthly, \$15 materials

Text: Geometry: Seeing, Doing and Understanding, 3e, Harold R. Jac obs, ISBN: 0-7167-4361-2 and the E nhanced Teacher's Guide, ISBN: 07167-5607-2

Prerequisites: completi on of Algebra I, optio nal placement test available from instructor

Description: This course is a study of traditional Euclidean Geometry. The student will become familiar with both plane and solid figures. The properties of the se figures will be studied through the use of definitions, postulates, and theorems. Geometry uses proofs to b uild logic skills and analytical thinking.

This text inc ludes high-interest, real-world exercises and humor to capture the students' interest and help them understand applications of what they are learning. A firm foundation in geometry is essential in furt her mathematical study and can help increase the appreciation of our world and our Creator.

Expect 5-6 hours coursework/week including daily lessons and tests. Tests will be provided by the instructor. Course grades given based on homework, tests, and class participation. Books can be purchased used or from publisher.

<u>Gym 2-3</u> – Marnie Lum

Grade: 2 - 3 Class Size: 16 to 24

Cost: \$20 monthly, \$20 materials Text: None

Prerequisites: None

Description: Physical Fitness is important for everyone. God created our bodies and we need to take good care of them. This class is intended to get your home schooler moving! During class we will do: warm ups/stretches/movement, calisthenics/exercises/strength building, cooperative learning games/relays, coordination development, sports skill bu ilding and more. Emphasis will be on: having a Christ like sportsmanship attitude, parti cipation, friendly competition and having fun. The main goal is to encourage a life-long love of physical activity. This class will overlap and share the gym with the Gals Only P.E. cl ass. T his will give the Gals leadership opportunities to work with younger kids and for the kids to have some great role models. Hands-On Equations – Denise Sumner Grade: 3-6

Class Size: 5 to 20

Cost: \$25 monthly, \$40 materials

Text: All materials supplied by teacher; includes binder and kit **Prerequisites:** Basic arithmetic

Description: Would you like your child to have an advantage when he/she takes Algebra? Hands-On Equations is a program designed to introduce younger children to concepts usually not introduced until Algebra. The program uses manipulatives to teach students to solv e equations and verbal problems. Once concepts are mastered, students transition to the tradi tional "paper and pencil" approach to solving equations. This method strengthens the student's understanding of algebraic concepts, problem solving and mental math skills, all while having fun.

Students must have a firm understanding of adding, subtracting and basic multiplying/dividing skills. Most work will be done during class. Homework will be up to 45 minutes per week depending on student's pace.

HS Spanish I – Fabiola Cripe

Grade: 9 - 12 Class Size: 10 to 20 Cost: \$20 monthly, \$50 materials Text: Provided by teacher Prerequisites: None

Description: Spanish 1 will present the basics of the S panish language. The student will learn greetings, verb conju gations, basic vocabulary, pronunciation and grammatical structures at a High School level. The student will develop reading and conversational abilities. The material emphasizes understanding and practical application rather than rot e memory. Through listening, speaking, reading and writing exercises student will learn to listen to, speak, read an d write Spanish, along with focusing on the usage of c orrect grammar. Prerequisites: None

We will dissect the elements of common communication and identify the skills needed to design, develop, and deliver a speech to a live audience. Every student will have the opportunity to give an informative, persuasive, inspirational, impromptu, and testimonial speech. We will also have professional guest speakers demonstrate the art and share practical tips into the world of speech. My g oal is to provide a safe environment for every student to d evelop the confidence and skills needed to be successful in the area of public speaking.

Cost: \$20 monthly, \$10 materials **Text:** list to be provided

Prerequisites: Students should be strong readers

Description: So many good books, so little time! This class is designed to i ntroduce the rudiments of critical re ading, discussion, and analytic skills to the pre-high school student. Using a variety of engaging and well-known works of literature, we will hone discussion skills and learn the basics of writing literary analysis. Strong reading skills are recommended, as all reading will be done outside of cl ass time. Pare nts are encouraged to be familiar with the books read in order to discuss possible mature subject matter with their students. Grade: 3 - 5

Class Size: 10 to 23

Cost: \$20 monthly, \$30 materials

Text: Shurley Grammar Level 4 - Teacher to provide **Prerequisites:** Student must be a strong reader.

Description: A solid understanding of grammar is useful for improving writing skills and learning a foreign language. Shurley Grammar is an extremely effective program for the acquisition and retention of grammar concepts. Chants an d jingles are used to learn the parts of speech, their function and how to locate them in a sente nce. Punctuation, capitalization, editing, synonyms/antonyms will also be taught. Grammar is often dry and boring, but this pro gram adds fun to the memorization and app lication of the concepts. Pare ntal attendance is encouraged, especially for the first 3 - 4 weeks of class. Students can expect 15 - 30 minutes of daily homework.

Spanish For You A – Susy Monroe Grade: 3 - 5 Class Size: 12 to 20 Cost: \$25 monthly, \$35 materials Text: None Prereguisites: None

Description: Come join us as we learn Spanish through games, songs, activities and constant review. Spanish is the second most spoken language in the world, and learning it can be fun. Students will be introduced to spoken and written Spanish. The vocabulary will be different than last year's, with some review of most used w ords, and will include colors, n umbers, transportation, animals, telling time, and much more. We will learn everyday conversation through dialog. I will include Bible verse memorization. Computer games will be sent almost every other week so the student will practice what was learned at class. We will have a points chart and a "tie nda" (store) around four times a year, to encourage practicing at home.

Homework: around 30-45 min. a week, and as much as you want to spend listening, reviewing, playing, and reading this beautiful language.

Transferable Cross Training: Apologetics – Karl Payne

Grade: 9 - 12

Class Size: 12 to 50

Cost: \$22 monthly, \$8 materials

Text: Provided by teacher

Prerequisites: A desire to b e challenged, and a willingness to apply what you have learned.

Description: This class on apo logetics deals prim arily with answering questions raised by friends or foes r egarding our Christian faith (1 Peter 3:15). Students are challenged to engage in conversations rather than run from the m, and will be trained how to do so, in a c lear, transferable, biblically based fashion. Topics examined will include, but not be lim ited to: The Deity of Christ, Liar, Lord or Lunatic, Arguments for and against the Resurrection, Exploring the Kingdom of the Cults, Understanding Islam, The Authenticity and Reliability of the Bible, Exposing the Jesus' Seminar, Evolution/Creation, Decoding the Da Vinci Code Fraud, Examining New Tolerance and Exposing the self-defeating suppositions of Cultural Relativism, Conventional Relativism and Individual Relativism.

World Geography - Eastern Hemisphere - Susan Kelley

Grade: 7 - 9 Class Size: 10 to 20 Cost: \$20 monthly, \$25 materials Text: Provided by teacher Prerequisites: None

Description: What a big world we live in! This is a t wo year rotational class with the Western Hemisphere the following year. In this class, we'll take a look at the eastern world and learn how and why borders have changed throughout history. This will include wars, climate changes, political and social needs. We will also learn basic map skills and how to use various maps. Learning will be through class discussions, lecture, activities and homework assignments. Each student will be provided with a world map and a notebook. Homework will consist of some book/internet assignments and some research p rojects. Homework should average about 2 hours per week. This is a graded class with grades based on class participation, homework and tests. Library and internet access will be necessary to complete some homework assignments.

Writing With Style 6-8 – Kimberly Williams Grade: 6 - 8

Class Size: 12 to 20

Cost: \$23 monthly, \$24 materials

Text: 3-ring binder, subject dividers, and thesaurus required

Prerequisites: A basic understanding of grammar is required **Description:** During the course of the year, this writing class will incorporate several writing styles and techniques. The several poetry forms, improving and class will include: expanding sentences and paragraphs by employing various style techniques, narrative writing, various outlining styles, basic research papers (including note taking techniques), some essay writing, and more. There will be a homework assignment each week. The 6th-8th grade class has higher expectations and moves at a faster pace than the same class offered for grades 4th-6th. Students registering outside grade levels MUST have prior teacher permission. The 6th-8th grade students will receive grade reports twice during the year. Homework: approximately 3-4 hours per week. It is strongly recommended that stud ents work with a quality grammar program while taking this class.

Academic Writing – Jenny Holmes

Grade: 9 - 12

Class Size: 10 to 25

Cost: \$25 monthly, \$25 materials

Text: Teacher will provide classroom materials and resources. **Prerequisites:** None. Class repetition encouraged.

Description: Writing is like math - it has structure, but writing is not like math because it's subjective. This course's aim is to provide students with the structure and feedback needed to be successful writers. It has thr ee goals: teach students how to systematically write a basic five paragraph essay; supply them with tips to i mprove their writing; and give them pr actice through a variety of assignments. Essa ys introduced include expository, persuasive, literary analysis, opinion editorial, a college admissions essay, and the SAT exam ess ay. Each year is uni que and will cover different essa y topics. Coursework includes: lecture, note taki ng, vocabulary study, writing, peer editing, review quizzes, and homework assignments. This class may qualify as a high school English credit when literature is done at home.

Homework: Approximately 30-60 minutes a day depending on the assignment.

Description: Beginning Guitar will teach students the basics of playing the guitar, even if they have not had previous experience playing an instrument. Chor ds, as well as some note re ading and tabs will be learned and before long they will be playing a number of songs. Class Size: 7 to 20 Cost: \$20 monthly, \$25 materials Text: None

Prerequisites: able to hold a p encil and write uppercase letters

Description: As we continue on the Writing Road to Reading, students will continue their mastery of the 70 phonograms of the English language. We will go further into the spelling list, and will focus on mastering the more difficult phonograms not mastered in the first Writing Road to Reading class. We will begin using our spelling words to make sentences and paragraphs, and learn the basics of gram mar and sentence structure. We will also read excerpts from quality literature together and focus on authors purpose and comprehension techniques. This will continue the multi-sensory approach to Language Arts on a more advanced level than the first class. Homework will include practicing phonograms both written and orally, practicing spelling words, and completing homework assignments given. If stude nts were not in the first W riting Road to Reading class, parents should contact me to get the phonogram cards and work on mastering the first 45 before the class begins in September.

Creative Kids – Laurie Werre

Grade: PS (age 3) - K

Class Size: 7 to 12 Cost: \$24 monthly, \$40 materials

Text: None

Prerequisites: Potty Trained

Description: This fun class for pre-school aged children will focus on themes of interest to them. Some examples include: friends, apples, leaves, p umpkins, thankfulness, Christmas, snow and cold, dinosaurs, space, rai nbows, bugs and seashore.

In addition, they will begin to learn the 28 sp elling rules. Students learn to write and say the symbols representing the sounds of speech. Next, with teacher guided dictation, they learn to sound out and write spelling words. Logical thinking will be incorporated as students learn to mark spelling concepts in words. Weekly homework will be assigned via email. Parents are expected to dictate spelling words and assist with homework every week to ensure we progress through the program at an appropriate pace. Students will independently mark the words at home and then we will analyze/correct in class. SW R integrates lan guage arts including grammar, composition, vocabulary, and spelling. Parents are encouraged to attend class when possible.

That's Greek To Me! - Terry Brenna

Grade: 4 - 6 Class Size: 10 to 25 Cost: \$20 monthly, \$32 materials Text: Provided by teacher Prerequisites: None

Description: Our world is filled with gifts from the Greeks! From alpha to om ega, study of the Greek alphabet and introductory overview of the language used during New Testament times is useful for un derstanding God's Word. W e'll also expl ore influences of ancient and modern Greece including famous Greeks, myths, legends, heroes, foods, g eography, arts, and culture. Students will be able to expand their English vocabulary by learning Greek roots and derivatives, and practice their writing and presentation skills with several reports. Homework consists of weekly review and research for the ne xt week's discussion, approximately two hours per week, plus report work. (Pl ease note this is more a H umanities class than a t ypical Foreign Language class.)

Writing For High School Level 1 – Kimberly Williams Grade: 8 - 10

Class Size: 12 to 18

Cost: \$25 monthly, \$25 materials

Text: Binder & Thesaurus: Student Supplied; "Grammatically Correct" by Anne Stilman: Teacher Supplied

Prerequisites: None

Description: This class will provide a writing program developed from various tea cher resources. It will include various paragraph formats, style and mechanics skills, some essays, and other high school writing. We will sharpen various writing skills including development of strong topic/thesis correcting modifiers/wordy sentence. dangling sentences/misplaced commas, correct usage of phrases and clauses, etc. Students will work on a variety of p aragraph forms, several short essa ys, and an MLA docum ented research paper. The course will offer a variety of writing forms and skills in order to pr ovide a bro ad base in writing experience. This course for younger High School students will develop a base for enr ollment in m ore advanced writing courses. Homework: Approximately 4-5 hours per week.

French 1 – Jolie Wolcott Grade: 8 - 12 Class Size: 6 to 20 Cost: \$25 monthly, \$20 materials Text: On y Va

Prerequisites: None

Description: French 1 will be a comprehensive course with the On y Va curriculum--textbook and workbook--that covers vocabulary, grammar, pronunciation/dictations, and cultural context. R eading, writing, speaking, and listening/translating will be part of our learning together. The On y Va curriculum is a two year program. Text and workbooks will be in addition to the materials fees.

<u>Musical Theatre Performance/Broadway Revue</u> – *Tina Matlock*

Grade: 8 - 12 Class Size: 10 to 25 Cost: \$30 monthly, \$50 materials Text: None Prerequisites: None

Description: The focus of this class is to give the students an opportunity to perform. Students will work on vocal technique and stage movement/choreography as they put together solo, duet, and ensemble numbers from musicals that will result in a revue, tailored to the talents of the students enrolled, to be presented as their final project on the second to last Thursday of Legacy. Each student is expected to work on his/her music at home d uring the week and memorize each song as it is learned. Due to the natur e of the class, weekly attendance is very important. There will be out-of-class rehearsals scheduled for solo work, dress reh earsal, and extra rehearsals on days when Legacy cannot meet at OCC.

Physics - Rhonda Zeutschel

Grade: 10 - 12

Class Size: 8 to 16

Cost: \$40 monthly, \$80 materials

Text: Exploring Creation with Physics: 2nd Ed, A pologia Educational Ministries. Students will also need a calculator with trig functions and scientific notation

Prerequisites: Completion of Algebra I

Description: Not only is physics fun, physics is the most elegant and fundamental of the sciences - it is a study of matter, energy, space and time. As chemistry is nothing more than the applied laws of physics and modern biology is merely applied chemistry, a scientific understanding of the world requires a knowledge of physics. In the mathematical precision of the laws of physics which apply to the universe, the hand of the Creator is revealed. This course u ses a r ather simplistic text and f ocuses on the basics of physics: Motion in one and two dimensions, Newton's Laws, Work, Energy, Waves, Optics, Electricity, and Magnetism. Class time will include both lecture and lab. Labs will include extensive work with computerized sensors introducing students to a level of technology not readily available in most class rooms. Homework includes reading text, completing problem sets and writing lab reports. Homework is e xpected to take 5 - 8 hours/week. While physics is fun, expect a LOT of math - soli d math skills and completion of Algebra I is required.
